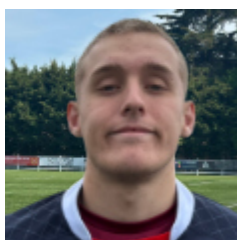

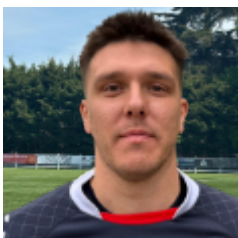

1,000 Hampshire players.

Hampshire have clocked up 1,000 players since World War II

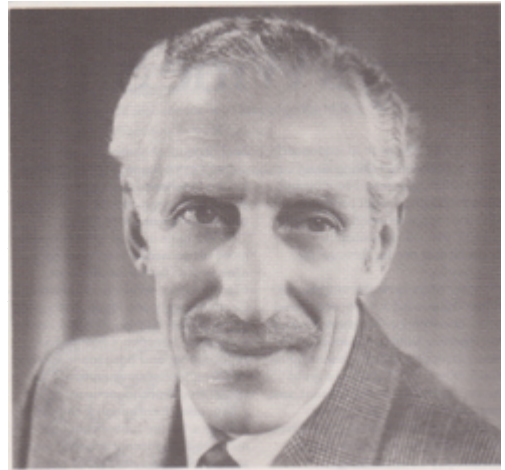
A major milestone passed by in match one at Horsham when the 1,000th player since World War II took the field for Hampshire in our 409th County Championship match since 1895 (tracing records of who had played for the County prior to WWII remains a work in progress).

The first three of the thousand all played for Hampshire before WWII; all served throughout that war.

Player number 2 was full-back in the first post-war match in October 1946 when we played Kent at Blackheath. At the end of the war, Stewart Howard-Jones from US was a Lieutenant Colonel in the Royal Tank Regiment who was first capped by Hampshire from Aldershot Services in December 1934. By September 1939, he has played for Hampshire nine times, for the Army against the Navy in 1936 and 1937 as well as the Barbarians on the Easter tours of Wales. He was also a travelling reserve for England in 1936. A career soldier, he won the Military Cross in Normandy 1944 and his DSO crossing the Rhine in March 1945. H-J played in the next two games in 1946 and then captained the County twice in 1947 making a total of fourteen Hampshire caps. He later served in the Korean War he died in 2002.

His captain that first match was a Commander. Player number 3, Commander RJL ("Wally") Hammond was a Gunnery Officer and a stalwart of US for many years. He was capped by Hampshire in December 1935 and a further eleven times before WW2 as well as every Army-Navy match in 1934 to 1939. In 1946, he captained the RN at Twickenham and the County four times

making a total of sixteen Hampshire caps. He was also a first-class cricketer, playing for Combined Services and captaining the side against the touring South Africans in 1951 - leading the likes of Brian Close, Fred Titmus and Jim Parks to a draw in their three-day clash at Burnaby Road. He passed in January 1991.



But by far our most senior player and rightly our number 1 was Dudley Thomas Kemp, "the father of Hampshire rugby". First capped at 19 as a back-row forward in November 1929, his last was 21 years later. He was at Guildford for the Championship match against Surrey in his capacity as County Secretary and Match Secretary. As an active referee Dudley always had his boots in the car; which was fortunate as the County was one player short! Dudley stepped up at age 40 to win his last and 46th cap as a winger. He had played once for England in 1935 when at Blackheath where he was in his mid-30s - the rest of his career was with Trojans. A Barbarian seven times between 1931 and

1938, he played for the County in both Championship winning finals, as captain in 1936. After the War, he was County Secretary from 1946 to 1967, RFU representative from 1958 to 1968 and President of the RFU in 1969/70, County President from 1973 to 1976. He died on 31st December 2002.

As a contrast, Player 20 is our youngest player ever, Robert Newman who was 17 and a quarter in 1946 was educated at Epsom College and played for New Milton and Bournemouth before his only cap as a prop. He emigrated to Australia a week later and went on to play for Australian Students and to become President of the Tasmania Rugby Football Union.

Player 100 was J.D. Hopkinson, a lock from Portsmouth who played five times (his first was in the centre!) between 1951 and 1955.

Player 200 was John Adrian Tremayne Rodd who would later become Lord Rennell. A Naval Officer playing at US; he appeared four times in 1957 and 1959 – on two other occasions being unavailable because he was playing for Scotland for whom he had fourteen caps he also played for and captained the Royal Navy and played twice for the Barbarians.

Player 300 was a centre from Trojans who had four caps 1966 to 1968 – K. Johnson. Player 400 was Adam Jelley from Havant who was capped six times as a lock from 1974 and 1978.

Player 500 was Neil Foster who played on 27 November 1982. A blind side flanker from Eastleigh who played just the one game. It took 20% fewer games but seven more years to reach player 1000 than it did to reach player 500.

Players 600 and 700 were both second-row locks from Havant – Mike Baldwin and Nick Allica. Mike previously with US was capped six times in 1992 and 1993 while Nick had four in 2003.

Player 800 was Channel Islander Michael Le Bourgeois a full back who played twice in 2010 before leaving Jersey in 2013 and going off to the Premiership via Bedford Blues and Wasps - before returning to the Blues in the Championship.

Player 900 had the one cap as a replacement hooker; Rhys Bingham from Gosport and Fareham came in for our last match in 2015.

And player 1000? At the end of last season, we were up to player 993. Our milestone player is the seventh of the seven new caps in the starting line-up last Saturday – and observing the usual naming protocol used in the press this was Franko Tomic from Petersfield and, like cap number one, an international player - Franko having played a number of times for the country of his birth, Croatia, making his debut against Sweden in late 2024.

Jed Stone looks back at previous meetings between the sides

Despite only being separated by Berkshire to the north, this is just the fourth County Championship meeting between Hampshire and Oxfordshire and the first for 20 years!

Our first meeting came at Burnaby Road in Portsmouth, the home of United Services Portsmouth where Hampshire returned a 40-15 victory in November 1994. Hampshire scored four tries through Harry Harrison, Rhys Roberts, Steve Boydell and Jason Ford whilst fly-half Martin Livesey slotted six penalties and a conversion.

Nine years later, the pair clashed in the County Championship Shield semi-finals at Basingstoke on 17 May 2003. After two wins in the Pool stage, defeating Eastern Counties 29-27 and Somerset 23-19, Hampshire welcomed Oxfordshire

On a windy, rainy afternoon, Nick Osman crossed after his brother Tim had kicked a penalty before Neil McGovern went over. Tim Osman landed a couple more penalties and then saw Matt Evans score in injury time but the conversion was missed and Hampshire would miss out 22-21.

Oxfordshire would lose the Final to Northumberland 27-8 a week later.

The last clash came at Chinnor on 29 April 2006 and Oxfordshire would comfortably win 44-20 in what could only be described as a difficult few days for the county team management!!

Steve Appleby had become the county team manager but had just started a



new job, was sent on a course out of town and was incommunicado.

Head coach Simon Morgan was on a site somewhere and couldn't get to a phone on the Friday and fellow coach Gareth Lewis was teaching.

So Jed Stone, the County Secretary, spent all day on Friday in the office trying to find players for the bench. The fourth was found at 7pm - much to the chagrin of Mrs. Stone!

All four got onto the pitch against a Chinnor-dominated Oxfordshire team while the fifth replacement was Matt Sharpe ... our physio and occasional Trojans third teamer who appeared on the blindside!

It is very much hoped that today's game will not require such measures as the Allianz Stadium at Twickenham awaits for the winners next Sunday.





Last weekend's match reports

Match reports from the men, women and Under 17s v Surrey

MEN SECURE SEMI-FINAL PLACE

Hampshire Men secured a thrilling 51–48 victory over Surrey to book their place in the semi-final of Division 3 in the Bill Beaumont County Championship.

Hampshire made a strong start and built an early lead, but Surrey responded well to keep the contest close throughout. Despite a number of yellow cards disrupting momentum at times, Hampshire managed the game effectively during the second half and held on for an impressive win.

The bench made a significant impact after the break, with Player of the Match CJ Fiern of Andover RFC contributing strongly in both attack and defence.

Half backs Tom Fieldsend (9) and Tom Meyer (10) also led from the front, controlling the tempo and territory with great kicking and decision making during key moments of the match.

VALUABLE EXPERIENCE FOR WOMEN

On Sunday, Hampshire Women travelled to Esher to face Surrey Women in even hotter conditions.

Hampshire started positively and took an early lead, but Surrey's direct midfield play, combined with a high penalty count against Hampshire, made it difficult for the visitors to maintain momentum, with Surrey winning the contest 35-12.

Natasha Bullock was named Player of the Match after leading from the front with a try and a committed defensive display.

There was also an impressive attacking performance from second row Sophie Slimm, who consistently caused problems for the Surrey defence with ball

in hand.

Although the result did not go Hampshire's way, the squad will take plenty from the experience. Competing in Division 1 has represented a significant step up for a young group of players, and the campaign has provided valuable learning opportunities to build on moving forward.

U17 BOYS FINISH UNBEATEN

Hampshire RFU Under 17 Boys hosted Surrey in the final match of their season programme at a sun-soaked Havant.

As in previous two fixtures, Hampshire started exceptionally well, putting into practice the patterns and structures developed over the past eight months.

Their power, pace and precision produced an outstanding opening 35 minutes, with Hampshire establishing a deserved 24–12 lead at half-time. Despite this, Surrey remained dangerous opponents and mounted an impressive comeback after the break.

Surrey scored 17 unanswered points during a high-quality second half to take a 29–24 lead with just five minutes remaining.

However, Hampshire showed great character and resilience in the closing stages. Despite the heat and the demands of a long season, the squad rediscovered their rhythm at the crucial moment, scoring two late tries to secure a dramatic 36–29 victory and complete an unbeaten campaign with three wins from three.

Beyond the result, the match was an excellent advert for Under 17 county rugby, with both sides playing competitively and in great spirit throughout.

Who's next for the winners? .

A look back at our record against either Essex or Leicestershire

Whoever wins today will meet either Essex or Leicestershire who play out their semi-final today at Harlow for a place in the final at Twickenham. The Division 3 Final is match number one on Sunday 7 June with a kick-off at 11am.

Hampshire were the first County to play Essex in the County Championship in May 2004 soon after they had separated from Eastern Counties to stand alone as a Constituent body. We lost by one score 23-20, trailing almost throughout the game.

A Nick Osman try and Steve 'Sid' Claffey penalty levelled the scores before the break but conceded twice that edged Essex into a sizeable lead. Dave Archer pulled one back and London Irish replacement Tony Paul set up a thrilling finale but it was too late.

Some 12 years passed before we would meet again, this time at Portsmouth RFC in May 2015 and they would get the better of the hosts 38-5 in a Shield Pool game.

Hampshire have played Leicestershire just once more than Essex. We won at Syston 38-3 in our first encounter in May 2002 after our 2001 hiatus.

Ten debutants were given their ties under coaches Roy Gittens and Simon Morgan and team manager David Ball and two tries from debutant Ali Ramus (Tottonians) led the way while Alan Barnes (Havant), David Rowledge (Alton) and Russell Osman (Henley) all crossed - Phil Osman kicked four conversions and two penalties in the comprehensive win in the East Midlands countryside.

Hampshire followed that with another victory, in the Final of the Plate in 2008 at Aldershot Military Stadium - there was no room at Twickenham for our Final that year!

After three pool games and a semi-final against Kent, we had scored 199 points and kept a clean sheet. Leicestershire were the first to score against that squad - 12 to our 22.

Tries from Simon Appleby, Simon Buckland and a former Havant player, coupled with seven points off the boot of Chris Ashwin was enough to secure the victory and their first county silverware since 1962.

Hampshire team that day: C Ashwin; R Buck, S Buckland (rep S Claffey), D Byett (rep K Molyneux), K Buttle; S Humberstone, G Morris (rep A Ashwin); N Young, S Cruddas (rep M Pearse), T Wells (rep K Osborne), S MacKechnie, R Forster, H Heasman, S Appleby, former Havant player (rep T Radbourne, rep L Richardson).

The post Final victory dinner was at the famous Lakeside Country Club, the former home of World Darts, and Mike Glogg, the county President was left to pay for the evening ... all the evening!

Our last encounter was at Twickenham in 2017. We lost in the brand-new Bill Beaumont Division Two Final 39-7 - dashing the chance for a second successive title - Tottonians' Pierre-Alex Clark scoring our only try with Alex Sutherland of Bournemouth converting.
